In 2014 Des Moines Rowing Club envisioned making rowing on the Des Moines River and Gray's Lake available to military veterans as well as other athletes who have physical challenges. In 2015 we adapted our first boat and found our first two rowers. In 2016 we purchased a single shell that was designed for adaptation and received funding to purchase a double shell, that will be used in 2017 to offer rowing clinics to interested parties.
